COLLECTIVE BARGAINING AGREEMENT

The Collective Bargaining Agreement (CBA) did expire on June 30, however, the CBA is in full force and effect. We will work under the provisions of the 2013-16 CBA.

IMPORTANT - RESIDENT EDUCATORS

Welcome all new teachers to CMSD! New teachers for the 2016-2017 school year who hold a Resident Educator Licenses or Alternative Resident Educators License must be enrolled in the Resident Educator Program. This is state law and you be assigned a Mentor. If you hold a 5-year professional license you will not be in the Resident Educator Program.

Debbie Paden, Resident Educator Program Coordinator, met many new teachers at BLUE at the end of July and explained the program. If you did not attend BLUE or have been recently hired in CMSD please make sure Debbie Paden has your name so you can be registered into ODE CORE.

HEALTHSPAN ENDS AUGUST 31

Michael Kulcsar wants to remind everyone that HealthSpan is ending their insurance coverage on August 31 (the company is essentially leaving the insurance business). For any member that still has health care coverage under HealthSpan, that coverage ends on August 31. Coverage with the new providers (either Aetna or MMO) will begin on September 1. Health care costs will increase for these members effective September 1. Any employee that did not make a selection during the Open Enrollment period will automatically be enrolled in Aetna with the same coverage and with the change in premium.

SPECIAL EDUCATION NOTES

Mary Moore wants to remind all Special Education teachers that they have one planning period per month for IEP writing. This should be part of the master schedule. Also, there must be intervention specialists assigned to the Planning Center two periods per day.

STUDENT GROWTH MEASURES

Mark Baumgartner wants you to know the Student Growth Measures (SGM) subcommittee met this summer to work on SY 2016-17 Student Growth Measures. The SLO

Portal will be more user-friendly and will have the ability to show the TDES team at the building many things, including: who has submitted SLOs and who is still working on them. Also, remember that eSchool Plus should be as accurate as possible when it comes to teacher schedules and what children teachers actually teach. This will help with the SLO process in the fall and the Linkage process in the spring. Safe Harbor ends after this year so this spring's Linkage will count for next year's teacher evaluation for Value Added grades and subjects. CONTINUING CONTRACTS

All certificated teachers and related service providers that are eligible to apply for a Continuing Contract must do so by September 15. The new forms will be available at the beginning of the school year. They will be available via CMSD email, CMSD website, CTU website, and at schools. You will need unopened transcripts. Transcripts should NOT be sent directly to the district. Transcripts should be sent to the educator and hand delivered to CMSD with the application. Jillian Ahrens recommends ordering 2 sets of transcripts so that you can open one and make sure that it is correct and has the information on it that you need to submit. That's how Jillian does it.

Make sure that you have an Approved IPDP on file. Write an IPDP as soon as you have your license in your hands. Do not wait until it is time to renew your license. An approved IPDP is needed BEFORE taking classes and earning CEUs. An IPDP Help Guide is available on the CTU and CMSD websites.
